The Community Physician Leadership Award 2022 Present by the 1998 Society of Children's Healthcare of Atlanta

In 1998, Egleston Children's Health Care System and Scottish Rite Children's Medical Center merged to formed Children's Healthcare of Atlanta. In honor of that merger, whose objective was to strengthen the healthcare provided to all of Georgia's children, the 1998 Society was formed. Comprised of physicians who are members of Children's medical staff, the 1998 Society is a non-profit organization that raises money through annual, personal contributions and fundraisers for Children's patients and families. Since its beginning, the Society has raised more than \$9 million dollars and supported multiple projects and programs to support the more than 350,000 patients that Children's cares for each year.
